4. As he got near his home, he saw his father looking down the road in his direction. It seemed as though the older man was looking for his son to return home. As the son watched, his father started running towards him, and threw his arms around him. With his heart filled with compassion for his son, he welcomed him back home!

5. The son immediately began to tell his father what he had planned to tell him: "Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son."



6. But before he could say any more, his father said to his servants, "Quick! Bring the best clothes and put them on him. Put a ring on his finger and sandals on feet. Bring a calf and prepare a feast and celebrate! "My son was dead but is alive again. He was lost but now he is found!"

Life was never the same for this young man. He had learned some very valuable lessons.





Prodigal Son Story – Number sketches in correct order


















THE FATHER OF THE RUNAWAY SON




