The Woman who Gave a Little But Gave Everything!



1. One day Jesus was teaching a large <u>crowd</u> of people in the Jewish Temple in Jerusalem. They <u>gathered around</u> Him and <u>gladly</u> listened to His teaching. As He taught them, He <u>warned</u> them, "<u>watch out for</u> the <u>teachers of the law</u>."

2. He <u>described</u> these teachers as <u>hypocrites</u>. [They were men who taught Others how they must live (i.e 'You must do this. You must do that.'), but they did not <u>put into practice</u> themselves, what they taught others, they should do.] Jesus <u>explained</u> that these teachers "liked to walk around ... and be <u>greeted</u> in the marketplaces and have the best seats in the <u>synagogues</u> and <u>places of honor</u> at <u>banquets</u>."





3. He also taught that these teachers <u>took advantage of widows</u> And demanded sacrifices of them that results in their loosing their homes. By following these teacher's <u>instructions</u>, they did not have enough money to live a <u>decent life</u> but became even more <u>poverty-stricken</u> and <u>unable to earn a living for themselves</u>.



4. After teaching them, Jesus and His disciples sat down <u>opposite</u> the place where people brought in their gifts of money for the Temple. As they watched the people bring their <u>offerings</u>, they saw many rich people come and bring large <u>contributions</u> and drop them into the offering box.

Then they saw a very poor widow come and drop in two small coins - worth about half a baht.

5. Jesus began to discuss with His twelve disciples, asking them if they had seen what had just happened. He then explained, "These rich people have been putting lots of money into this offering box. They have given what they will never even miss because they have given out of the abundance of their wealth."

6. "But the truth is," Jesus said, "this poor widow has <u>given more than</u> <u>all the others put together!</u> She is <u>poverty-stricken</u> but has <u>given by far</u> the biggest offering today. She has put in all that she had - everything that she had to live on. The rich gave out of their <u>surplus</u>; she has given out of her great <u>lack</u>."





Jesus could see into her heart and knew all about her life's circumstances. He cared about her and her needs. The Bible does not tell us, but He probably reached out to help her that day!
