Besides these miracles Jesus changed the hearts and lives of many people.

Here are a couple of examples:

John 4:1-41 The Lonely woman who received a new life.

Luke 19:1-9 The Cheater (Tax collector) who received a new heart.

A. John 2:1-11

1. Two days later there was a wedding in the town of Cana in Galilee. Jesus' mother was there, 2. and Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. 3. When the wine had given out, Jesus' mother said to him, "They have run out of wine." 4. "You must not tell me what to do," Jesus replied. "My time has not yet come." 5. Jesus' mother then told the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." 6. The Jews have rules about ritual washing, and for this purpose six stone water jars were there, each one large enough to hold about a hundred liters. 7. Jesus said to the servants, "Fill these jars with water." They filled them to the brim, 8. and then he told them, "Now draw some water out and take it to the man in charge of the feast." They took him the water, 9. which now had turned into wine, and he tasted it. He did not know where this wine had come from (but, of course the servants who had drawn out the water knew); so he called the bridegroom 10. and said to him, "Everyone else serves the best wine first, and after the guests have had plenty to drink, he serves the ordinary wine. But you have kept the best wine until now!" 11. Jesus performed this first miracle in Cana in Galilee: there he revealed his glory, and his disciples believed in him.

B. Matthew 8:23-27

23. Jesus got into a boat, and his disciples went with him. 24. Suddenly a fierce storm hit the lake, and the boat was in danger of sinking. But Jesus was asleep. 25. The disciples went to him and woke him up. "Save us, Lord!" they said. "We are about to die!" 26. "Why are you so frightened?" Jesus answered. "What little faith you have!" Then he got up and ordered the winds and the waves to stop, and there was a great calm. 27. Everyone was amazed. "What kind of man is this?" they said. "Even the winds and the waves obey him!"

C. Mark 1:40-42

40. A man suffering from a dreaded skin disease came to Jesus, knelt down, and begged him for help. "If you want to," he said "you can make me clean." 41. Jesus was filled with pity, and reached out and touched him. "I do want to," he answered. "Be clean!" 42. At once the disease left the man, and he was clean.

D. Matthew 9:18-19, 23-25

18. While Jesus was saying this, a Jewish official came to him, knelt down before him, and said, "My daughter has just died; but come and place your hands on her, and she will live." 19. So Jesus got up and followed him, and his disciples went along with him.

23. Then Jesus went into the official's house. When he saw the musicians for the funeral and the people all stirred up, 24. he said, "Get out, every-body!" The little girl is not dead -- she is only sleeping!" Then they all started making fun of him. 25. But as soon as the people had been put out, Jesus went into the girl's room and took hold of her hand, and she got up.

E. Mark 2:1-12

A few days later Jesus went back to Capernaum, and the news spread that he was at home. 2. So many people came together that there was no room left, not even out in front of the door. Jesus was preaching the message to them 3. when four men arrived, carrying a paralyzed man to Jesus. 4. Because of the crowd, however, they could not get the man to him. So they made a hole in the roof right about the place where Jesus was. When they had made an opening, they let the man down, lying on his mat. 5. Seeing how much faith they had, Jesus said to the paralyzed man, "My son, your sins are forgiven." 6. Some teachers of the Law who were sitting there thought to themselves, 7 "How does he dare talk like this? This is blasphemy! God is the only one who can forgive sins!" 8. At once Jesus knew what they were thinking, so he said to them, "Why do you think such things? 9. Is it easier to say to this paralyzed man, 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say, 'Get up, pick up your mat, and walk'? 10. I will prove to you, then that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins." So he said to the paralyzed man, 11. "I tell you, get up, pick up your mat, and go home!" 12. While they all watched, the man got up, picked up his mat, and hurried away. They were all completely amazed and praised God, saying, "We have never seen anything like this!"

F. Matthew 9:32-33

32. As the men were leaving, some people brought to Jesus a man who could not talk because he had a demon. 33. But as soon as the demon was driven out, the man started talking, and everyone was amazed. "We have never seen anything like this in Israel!" they exclaimed.

G. Matthew 15:32-39

32. Jesus called his disciples to him and said, "I feel sorry for these people, because they have been with me for three days and now have nothing to eat. I don't want to send them away without feeding them, for they might faint on their way home." 33. The disciples asked him, "Where will we find enough food in this desert to feed this crowd?" 34. "How much bread have you got?" Jesus asked. "Seven loaves," they answered, "and a few small fish." 35. So Jesus ordered the crowd to sit down on the ground. 36. Then he took the seven loaves and the fish, gave thanks to God, broke them, and gave them to his disciples; and the disciples gave them to the people. 37. They all ate and had enough. Then the disciples picked up the seven baskets full of pieces left over. 38. The number of men who ate was four thousand, not counting the women and children. 39. Then Jesus sent the people away, got into a boat, and went to the territory of Magadan.

H. Matthew 14:22-33

22. Then Jesus made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead to the other side of the lake, while he sent the people away. 23. After sending the people away, he went up a hill by himself to pray. When evening came, Jesus was there alone; 24. and by this time the boat was far out in the lake, tossed about by the waves, because the wind was blowing against it. 25. Between three and six o'clock in the morning Jesus came to the disciples, walking on the water. 26. When they saw him walking on the water, they were terrified. "It's a ghost!" they said, and screamed with fear. 27. Jesus spoke to them at once. "Courage!" he said. "It is I. Don't be afraid!" 28. Then Peter spoke up. "Lord, if it is really you, order me to come out on the water to you." 29. "Come!" answered Jesus. So Peter got out of the boat and started walking on the water to Jesus. 30. But when he noticed the strong wind, he was afraid and started to sink down into the water. "Save me, Lord!" he cried. 31. At once Jesus reached out and grabbed hold of him and said, "What little faith you have! Why did you doubt?" 32. They both got into the boat, and the winds died down. 33. Then the disciples in the boat worshipped Jesus. "Truly you are the Son of God!" they exclaimed.

I. Luke 18:35-43

35. As Jesus was approaching Jericho, there was a blind man sitting by the road, begging. 36. When he heard the crowd passing by, he asked, "What is this?" 37. Jesus of Nazareth is passing by, "they told him. 38. He cried out, "Jesus! Son of David! Have pity on me!" 39. The people in front scolded him and told him to be quiet. But he shouted even more loudly, "Son of David! Have pity on me!" 40. So Jesus stopped and ordered the blind man to be brought to him. When he came near, Jesus asked him, 41. "What do you want me to do for you?" "Sir," he answered, "I want to see again." 42. Jesus said to him, "Then see! Your faith has made you well." 43. At once he was able to see, and he followed Jesus, giving thanks to God. When the crowd saw it, they all praised God.

J. Matthew 15:29-31

29. Jesus left these and went along by Lake Galilee. He climbed a hill and sat down. 30. Large crowds came to him, bringing with them the lame, the blind, the crippled, the dumb, and many other sick people, whom they placed at Jesus' feet; and he healed them. 31. The people were amazed as they saw the dumb speaking, the crippled made whole, the lame walking, and the blind seeing; and they praised the God of Israel.
