## The Rejected Woman whom Jesus Accepted



1. One day Jesus was invited to eat in the home of Simon, a self-righteous Jewish religious leader. While they were eating together, something unusual happened. A woman known for being immoral came walking into the room.

2. She carried a beautiful jar of expensive perfume. She came to where Jesus was eating, knelt down and began weeping. As



her tears fell on His feet, she wiped them with her long hair. Then she poured the very expensive perfume on Jesus' feet.

3. Simon was horrified at what he saw was happening. He knew the woman was a prostitute. He looked at Jesus and wondered how He

could tolerate this woman doing this to Him. He thought to himself, "This proves that Jesus is no prophet. If God had really sent Him, He would know what kind of woman is touching Him. She's a sinner!" NLB\*



4. Jesus looked inside Simon's heart and knew what he was thinking. He said to him, "Simon, I have something to tell you." Then Jesus told him the following "A man loaned money to two people—five hundred pieces of silver to one story: and fifty pieces to the other. But neither of them could repay him, so he kindly forgave them both, canceling their debts. Who do you suppose

loved him more after that?" NLB\*

5. Simon answered, "I suppose the one for whom he canceled the larger debt." "That's right," Jesus said, Then Jesus turned to the woman and said to Simon, "Look at this woman kneeling here. When I entered your home, you didn't offer Me water to wash the dust from My feet, but she has washed them with her tears and wiped them with her hair...."

6. Then Jesus told Simon: "You <u>neglected</u> the <u>courtesy</u> of olive oil to <u>anoint</u> My head, but she has anointed My feet with rare perfume. I tell you, her sins —and they are many—have been forgiven, so she has shown me much love. But a person who is forgiven little shows only a little love." NLB\*

7. Then Jesus said to the woman, Your sins are forgiven." The men at the table said among themselves, "Who does this man think He is, going around forgiving sins?" NLB\*

And Jesus said to the woman, "Your faith has saved you; go in peace." NLB\*
