

A Good Neighbor - A Helper in Your Time of Need! (Pre-Intermediate)

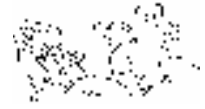
1. One day, a Jewish man was walking along a very dangerous mountain road in Israel.
